I have thoroughly reviewed the Eligibility Request Form that has been submitted seeking a waiver of OSAA Rule 8.2 (Fifth Year). From the documentation that you have submitted I have concluded the following:

Findings of Fact:

1. Tanner first entered the 9th grade in September 2011 at Kings Valley Charter School and his 4 consecutive years of eligibility expired at the conclusion of the 2014-15 school year.
2. Tanner has not graduated from high school. He has accumulated 23.84 credits thus far and still needs 0.16 credits to graduate. (Elective 0.16)
3. Tanner was enrolled in school and received academic credit during each of his 8 consecutive semesters in high school.

Conclusions:

OSAA Rule 8.2.4 lists specific criteria that must be considered when evaluating a request for a Fifth Year of eligibility. From the information submitted I conclude the following regarding these criteria:

1. The student has not graduated from high school. Tanner meets this criteria as he still needs 0.16 credits to receive his high school diploma.
2. The student must meet one of the following criteria:
 - a. The Student's Individualized Education Program (IEP) Team has determined that the student has a "disability" as determined under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), and that the student was meeting the requirements of the student's IEP, yet was unable to graduate from high school within eight semesters after entering the 9th grade primarily because of the disability. There is nothing in the documentation submitted to indicate that Tanner has a disability as defined under IDEA. Therefore, he does not meet this criteria.
 - b. Due to circumstances beyond the control of each of the student and the student's parent(s), there has been both a significant absence from school (not less than one semester) and an inability to obtain academic credit during that period of absence. There is no such gap in Tanner's academic record. In fact, the record indicates that Tanner "...decided not to take the necessary classes to graduate so that he can return for another school year". Therefore, Tanner does not meet this criteria.



I feel as the parent of Tanner Simmons I need to explain how this request for a 5th year came about. Tanner is an extremely bright child. When he was in 4th grade he was doing the class work of a 6th grader so my wife, Tanner and I decided to move him up one grade. Skipping ahead to when he entered high school as a 9th grader he joined the football team. During his 9th grade year he obtained a football related injury that limited him to only play in 2 games (and that is a stretch as he plays in the 1a, and as a 9th grader did not receive a lot of playing time). This past year going into the last semester we/he decided not to take the necessary classes to graduate so that he can return for another school year in turn to take as many AP courses that fit his schedule. I have a student who would like to apply for a 5th year hardship. His circumstances are a bit unique. This student also happens to be my son not that it matters. I have the paperwork filled out but I do not know what else needs to go along with it so that is why I am writing this to you. My son skipped a grade in elementary school so when he was a freshmen he really should have been a 8th grader. He went out for football and going into the (the week of practice) second game of his freshmen year sustained a injury and did not return until the final game. So essentially he only was available to play 2 games (not that he played much since it is 8-man football and he was a freshmen). Here is the language from the OSAA Handbook regarding 5th year requests:

- 8.2.4. Fifth Year Hardship Appeals Procedure.** The Executive Board, or as it may provide, the Executive Director, may in individual cases, upon written request ***once the student has begun his/her last transcribed grading period prior to exhausting his/her eligibility***, declare eligible for up to one year a student who would otherwise be ineligible under **Rule 8.2., "Duration of Eligibility/Graduation"** because more than eight semesters have passed after the student entered the 9th grade if the student has not previously been granted eligibility based upon a fifth year or age hardship appeal and all of the following conditions are met:
- (a) the student has not graduated from high school;
 - (b) the student establishes, to the reasonable satisfaction of the Executive Board or the Executive Director, as the case may be, either:
 - (1) that the student's Individualized Education Program Team has determined that the student has a "disability" (as defined below), and that the student was meeting the requirements of the student's IEP, yet was unable to graduate from high school within eight semesters after entering the 9th grade primarily because of the disability; or
 - (2) **due to circumstances beyond the control of *each of* the student *and* the student's parent(s), there has been both a significant absence from school (not less than one semester) and an inability to obtain academic credit during that period of absence;** and
 - (c) the student establishes, to the reasonable satisfaction of the Executive Board or Executive Director, as the case may be, that the student's participation would not constitute an undue risk to the health or safety of other participants.
 - (d) Without limiting the evidence that may be considered, the Executive Board or Executive Director, as the case may be, may consider the following in determining whether the student's participation would constitute an undue risk to the health or safety of other participants:
 - (1) whether the student has presented a report from a physician regarding the student's height, weight and whether the student is likely to pose an undue risk to the safety and health of other participants; the student shall submit to an independent medical examination by a physician selected by and paid for by the Association at the request of the Executive Board or Executive Director; and
 - (2) whether the sport is a contact or a non-contact sport.
 - (e) Should an otherwise ineligible student who has already been granted a year of eligibility under the provisions of this rule apply for eligibility for a subsequent year, the Executive Board, or as it may provide, the Executive Director may consider the following factors in addition to those previously stated in this rule:

- (1) Whether the student has previously participated in the sport for which eligibility is sought, or a similar sport; and
- (2) Whether the student's skill level in the sport for which eligibility is sought is such that the student was ever a member of a starting team or was the recipient of league or other honors as a result of participation in the sport; and
- (3) Whether the student has participated in a prior state championship competition (either in an individual sport or a team sport).

For purposes of this Rule 8.2.4, "disability" shall have the meaning provided in the with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1401(a).

Individuals

The Executive Board or the Executive Director may grant eligibility as to one sport and deny it as to another sport.

A decision of the Executive Director may be appealed to the Executive Board. A decision of the Executive Board may be appealed to a Hearings Officer under Rule 9, "Hearings Officer."
