Dear Mr. Hughes;

We are writing to provide background information supporting our son, Harrison Dreyer, and his possible eligibility in fall sports with the OSAA.

On March 14, 2015, we did an intervention with Harrison, removing him from Jesuit High School and enrolling him in a wilderness program at Second Nature Uintas in Utah. He remained in the wilderness program, living in the Utah desert, for 88 days, in a rigorous physical, mental, academic and personal care program. He was in the care of the program psychologist and staff therapists, and was treated for depression and anxiety. He successfully graduated on June 11, 2015.

While at Second Nature Uintas, Harrison completed three academic courses in English, Psychology, PE, earning .25 credits per class through the State of Utah public high school system. He completed no additional academic credit during the second semester of his freshman year.

While he is currently short of academic credits as per OSAA, we have met with Mr. Chris Smart, Vice President and Academic Dean of JHS, who has assured Harrison that he remains on track to graduate JHS in Spring 2018, provided Harrison continues to take a standard academic load for the next three years.


We ask the OSAA to consider allowing Harrison to remain eligible to compete in a Fall sport at JHS (specifically, Cross Country), because physical fitness/rigor greatly supports Harrison's continuing therapeutic growth and progress. Should you need further documentation to support the importance of physical fitness for Harrison, we can provide a letter from his psychiatrist, Jeanne Johnson, MD.
