Metro Hardship Committee,

Harrison Dreyer attended Jesuit as a freshmen last year. In March, he withdrew because of emotional reasons and attended a wilderness school in Utah for 88 days. He has now rejoined Jesuit as a sophomore. Since he earned credits at the Second Nature Unitas Wilderness School, he is now considered a transfer.

Also, because of the emotional issues he struggled with, he did not pass 5 classes last semester. With the 1.5 credit he will receive through the wilderness school, he is on track to graduate (9.5 credits is needed at the start of 2nd year at Jesuit. Harrison has 9.0 at Jesuit and another 1.5 from the Second Nature Unitas Wilderness School for a total of 10.5 credits).

The parents tell me that his counselors state that exercise is important to his full emotional recovery. Also, while he is technically considered a transfer, there was never any intent to transfer schools. The Second Nature Unitas Wilderness School was primarily a treatment facility, but because he earned credit, it is technically considered a transfer. The family's intent was always to continue enrollment at Jesuit.
