



Our son, Josiah Kellogg, age 17 and grade 12, will be attending Pine Eagle Charter School for the 2015-2016 school year. He is living with Ty and Aimee McCall and they have guardianship for him. Sports are very important to Josiah and it is important for him to participate in sports at Pine Eagle.

We adopted Josiah from foster care at age 7. Josiah has been abused and neglected in his life. Josiah has a lot of anxiety and energy. Sports have been a great outlet for him and have helped him in his life. He sometimes has a difficult time socially. Having a good friend is really important for him.

Josiah attended La Grande High School his freshman year as we live in La Grande. He had a difficult time socially. He made a good friend the following summer at a regional church activity and asked if he could transfer to Cove Charter School so he could attend school with his friend. His new friend, Bailey Hill, was a year older and a cross country runner. Josiah attended Cove Charter School his sophomore and junior years. Josiah lived at home while attending school there. Bailey graduated this year.

In the spring of this year Josiah obtained a cell phone without our knowledge and only used it at school. He made some bad choices at school because of it and it affected his relationship with his teachers.

Josiah became friends with Nathan McCall through our church's regional activities in the last couple years. Nathan is 16, a junior and attends Pine Eagle. In May they played basketball together at a church campout and Nathan invited Josiah to come to a basketball camp with him as his team was shorthanded. After the camp the boys approached us about attending school together, either in Cove or Pine Eagle. Both parents immediate response was no as neither parent wanted to have their son live away from home, but both boys have shown signs of possible depression due to not having a good friend, so we decided to explore it. Nathan stayed at our home for a few days and Josiah stayed at the McCalls for a few days. We spent a month seriously considering if a move to put the boys together would be beneficial for them and how it would affect our families. We had many conversations with Ty and Aimee McCall. After much thought we decided that the best choice for the boys and our families would be for Josiah to attend Pine Eagle. No one from either coaching staff was involved or knew the families were talking about the boys moving.

We sincerely hope you will consider this request and allow Josiah to play sports at Pine Eagle.

To whom it may concern: I am a student athlete who has attended Cove High School for the past few years. My parents enrolled me in Cove to be in a smaller school setting my sophomore year. I spent my Freshman year at La Grande, and it was terrible. Every day I got offered drugs, all the time. I hated it. I am LDS and my family has rules against such substances, but they're also just unhealthy and unappealing. I played football, and it was the only good thing about school. But one trip home some seniors offered me "the chance" to do drugs with them, and I said no so they threatened me because they thought I would tell on them, but I'm not that type of person. Anyways, I got beat up for it and they later brushed it off as freshman hazing. So my parents offered that I could leave and go to a smaller local school. My father liked Imbler, but I liked Cove. My parents liked cove for the student/teacher ratios and such, and I liked it for sports. I have always loved football, but I love 8 man football. I enjoy how there is more speed in the game and how it has a faster pace than 11 man football. Going to a small school like Cove gave me the opportunity to play basketball, whereas at another school I definitely would not have even tried out. I could hardly dribble when I started. Sports put aside, I like how small schools have the community more involved in what they do, in everything, sports, FFA, even fall festivals and plant sales. I think students being involved in the community is important, and small schools in small places are ideal for such. So that's why we liked Cove. Last year, some of my reasons for loving Cove disappeared. Mr. Koehn, was a fantastic ag teacher and by far the best part of my day every day. But he left his position at Cove and suffered heart failure and now teaches at Joseph. Cove moved up to 2A, and 8 man football left. One of our teachers consistently came to school drunk or hungover and that wasn't typically pleasant. So again, this year my dad offered I could switch schools. Besides issues at school, I have been dealing with issues such as pornography addiction from being molested as a younger child, it created issues. I deal with shame because of this, and depression, and sometimes suicidal urges. As a family, we have worked to resolve these, and I have had some counseling which has been beneficial. I'm also adopted, and my parents have 9 children and are adopting three more. Sports have always been a great release for me. It's a great way for me to channel all the energy I have and put it to good use. I love sports too. They're important to me. I have played sports since I was younger I started in 2nd grade and football especially, is one of my passions. Sports have always been important to me and my family, and my dad's rule is if you don't play a sport you get a job. So sports. Sports anyday. So this summer I spent some considerable time with Nathan McCall, he's been one of my friends over the years, and his family also is LDS. Looking over the options, for leaving Cove, none seemed quite right for me. So Nathan, one day jokingly said "You could totally come to school with me" and then I considered it a serious option. And I asked my parents and they thought it would be good too, after weighing the options they decided that moving would be good, for me individually. And so we decided to go that direction. So all in all my family and I feel that going to Pine Eagle Charter School, would be most beneficial.
