To whom this may concern:

I am writing this letter to explain why my daughter Jada Webb has moved to Coos Bay to live with her older sister Olivia Pizano for this 2015-2016 school year. Both girls came to my husband and I with the idea of allowing Jada to move for the school year to live with Olivia. We thought it would be a good idea to let her go experience a new school and new environment for one year. We allowed Olivia to go live during her junior year in southern California to live with her grandfather and she loved the experience. We did set several rules with Jada when we decided to allow her to go and those were that she had to keep her grades up. She held a GPA over a 3.2. Another rule was she would have to play soccer. She has been playing soccer since she was 5 years old, as well as other sports. The past two years she has played on Henley's JV Girls soccer team. She did have a full-time summer job at Subway here in Klamath and when she left they told her they would be more than happy to give her a job referral to Subway in Coos Bay when she was ready to apply for a job. Jada is a very sweet, kind hearted, smart and hard working girl. She will be a great asset to your school and soccer team. Both girls are very responsible and we trust them very much.

Olivia is currently enrolled as a sophomore at SWOCC and is the captain of the woman's soccer team as well as a wrestler for their woman's team. I have written a letter and had it notarized allowing Olivia to register and seek medical attention for Jada if ever needed. We keep in contact with both girls daily and plan to make several trips to visit them and to come watch them play in their sports activities.
