This letter is being written in support of Wesley Loveland and his application for an academic hardship for the current soccer season of the 2015-16 school year.

The Situation:

Wesley is a sophomore attending CHS following a poor performance in his freshman spring trimester at Canby. He had some medical issues and struggled with family dynamics, which contributed to him failing 3 classes. I have included a letter from the doctor he visited during this stressful time last spring. He is recovering one class through an online program and will need to make up the other course in his schedule for this year. In our schedule, it is manageable for students to get back on track for graduation through their regularly scheduled classes for the year.

The Plan for Support:

Wesley is currently enrolled in five classes in addition to his online recovery class. We will keep Wesley on weekly progress reports for the duration of first trimester in order to assure his progress towards his goals of catching up. If necessary, we will work with the coach to provide time away from practice in order to maintain his academic progress and eligibility. If Wesley is unable to maintain this effort through the course of the first trimester, he will lose his eligibility from the school's perspective for the remainder of the season.

Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have further questions about this situation. It is my hope that this plan and explanation of circumstances are sufficient for the Three Rivers League to grant Wesley eligibility for the 2015 soccer season.
