My name is Mason Sibley and I go to Toledo high school. I am in the 12th grade. I have always had a hard time with certain classes and have always needed extra help. I have been on an IEP for most of my schooling up until this past April when I was moved to a 504. Over the summer I completed an online course to make up for one of the classes I failed. To be completely honest, the reason why I failed my classes was because I had some personal legal stuff happening in my life which caused me to miss quite a bit of school. Most of the time it was really hard for me to study and keep every bit of information in my head because I usually forget things a lot and have had a really rough year. I realize how much school and grades really mean and how they are going to impact my future. Football has always been my one true love and my favorite sport. I have played it since the fourth grade. When I'm out on the field I just go to another place and forget about everything and football makes me happy and makes me be the person who I am. I am strong, hard working, caring, nice and a helpful kind of guy. I was not able to compete in track and field due to the legal issues which was very hard on me emotionally. It really hurt and upset me because it's my second favorite sport. This is my senior year, I know that I need to be on top of things in order to complete my goals and be able to graduate. Looking back on all of my decisions that have led to this situation has changed my outlook on the importance of schooling and being on top of my requirements. I know that my past doesn't define my future. I am determined to excel in all of my classes and my activities outside of the classroom. Playing my last year of football would mean the world to me, not only will it make me emotionally happy it also shows me that I can overcome obstacles and learn from my mistakes. I am asking you to please give me a second chance and the opportunity to show what I am capable of. I know that with your approval and my hard work I can succeed in both my schooling and sports. I have never been in this situation before; from the legal stuff to failing classes and having to ask for a second chance. Thank you for listening.

Dear Hardship Committee:

My name is Shannon Goodell and I am writing to you in reference to my son Mason Sibley. Mason is going into his senior year at Toledo Junior/Senior High School where he has attended for the past three years. During his time at TJSH he has participated every year in several different sports with football being his favorite. I have encouraged him to participate in athletics since he was in grade school and I have always found it to be an extremely important learning tool along with his education. Mason has been on an IEP since he was in the 2nd grade and only just this past April was moved to a 504 plan. He has always struggled since he was a child with his school work where sports have always come so natural. I have tried to reiterate to him the importance of his education and how in order to participate in any kind of athletics he will need to keep up with his school work. So far this has never been an issue as he has always done what needed to be in order to participate until now. This year has been a very difficult one not only on Mason but on his family as well. His junior year started out fine and in February things took a drastic turn for the worse which has now left me here writing this letter. Without going into detail because we are still dealing with this whole situation, he came in to some unfortunate legal trouble that completely changed and set the course for the remainder of the school year. Everything started in February and came to a head during spring break and unfortunately he was not able to keep up with his school work. He was taken out of school for a short time while we worked through some of the legalities with the school Principal Mr. Raever, our attorney and also the juvenile department counselor. After he was allowed to return to school full time we still had quite a few absences due to attorney meetings and court dates that we were unable to avoid. During these absences either myself or Mason would collect the missing work but unfortunately this left him without a lot of explanations on how to do the work and in turn his grades failed. The school counselor set up summer courses for him at the end of the final semester to make up his failing grades. It took me a short time to get the information from her as far as his login and password goes so he got a later start on it then he should have. During this time he was also participating in the football camp that Coach Helmandollar had set up for the week of June 22nd thru the 25th. He was trying to do the online courses but without explanation from his teacher he was really struggling to make an progress. On Wednesday June 24th during football camp they were playing in just helmets, he went out for a pass and as he dove to the ground for the catch he broke his collarbone. I received a call from one of the coaches telling me what had happened and that they believed it was in fact

broken and would need to seek medical attention. After arriving at the emergency room and taking x-rays the doctors stated he not only broke his collarbone but also had a broken piece of bone lodged in between the two halves which would require surgery. The hospital in Newport was not equipped for this type of procedure thus sending us out to the Corvallis Hospital the following morning for surgery. During this time at the hospital and shortly afterwards his main concern was whether or not he would still be able to play football in the fall. It took him nearly a week before he felt up to doing much of anything and tried to resume with the online courses. The more lost he got with it the more frustrated he became and I could see a change in his attitude. Mason has always been a positive kid so I made arrangements to meet with the football coach and also the school counselor to see what we could do. With everything negative that has happened to him this year and the injury his studies really suffered. Sports has always played a huge part of his life and when he was told he could not participate in track he was devastated. I saw a change in him that was so hard to watch and I am so afraid if he is not allowed to participate in football that his moral will only get worse. Mason was able to complete one of the two online courses with a lot of struggle and determination but unfortunately that leaves him 1 credit shy of the required 5 to participate. I am asking you to please consider allowing him to participate in football, I know how much this means to him to play and after the year he has had I really can't bare to see him go through another disappointment. This is his final year of school and is on schedule to graduate, however like I said I do really worry what his attitude and everything will be like if he is unable to play. I will make sure that he stays on top of his schoolwork not only during the football season but for the remainder of the school year. I really appreciate you taking the time to read this letter and I just ask that under these unfortunate circumstances that you allow him to participate.
