

To whom it may concern:

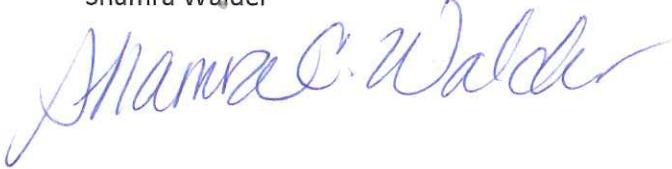
