

Dear Terri ,

This letter is to verify that Donald Biehn successfully completed a 5-week, residential job training, employment and education program with Northwest Youth Corps (NYC) in 2015.

NYC is a summer youth conservation corps program modeled after the Civilian Conservation Corps of the 1930s. As a participant, Donald worked approximately 180 paid hours and completed approximately 25 hours (non-paid) of planned education (SEED) curriculum. Donald completed a pre- and post-assessment test of this curriculum and demonstrated a 66.67% increase. Based on National Education Standards, corpsmembers earn 1 credit for Physical Education and 1/4 credit for Natural Resource Education.

Through NYC's Outdoor High School, our YouthCorps field programs offer an accredited education curriculum (SEED*) for participants. This program offers 1-3 hours of daily educational activities, which cover local and global environmental issues, outdoor living skills, job search and preparation training. Corpsmembers are given a NYC SEED workbook, which corresponds to the curriculum of the program and includes an Assessment Form to account for corpsmember involvement in the program. The Northwest Association of Accredited Schools has certified Northwest Youth Corps as an accredited provider since 2001.

NYC crewmembers spend 6-8 hours each day engaged in work projects that require strenuous physical activity. Such projects include building and maintaining hiking trails, fences, foot bridges, hauling brush, pruning trees to 18 feet, and various other conservation projects. Crewmembers will work in the backcountry and may hike up to 10 miles through wilderness terrain to access their project site. Crewmembers work with hand tools and carry all tools/equipment to and from the work project each day. On weekends, crews participate in recreational activities such as hiking, playing volleyball, caving or visiting nearby attractions.

At NYC, job skill development is a part of every day. On the job site, skills such as cooperation, patience, dependability, work quality and teamwork are taught. Evening programs address resume writing, interview skills and job search skills. Each crewmember is given a complete evaluation on their performance in areas of dependability, job performance and worksite relationships. NYC participants receive a stipend pay and work a 30-40 hour week.
