Hi Travis—

Maya did try out here at Hermiston HS this fall, but was unsuccessful at making the team. I am unaware of any personal issues that she may have been dealing with that may have caused the move to Stanfield as I did not see her being bullied or harassed, or made aware of any communications/reporting of such to our Vice Principals. At no time was I contacted about her potentially moving to another school. I spoke with her mother Robin on the phone yesterday and at no time did she convey anything about transferring. I know the situation that arose after our team volleyball rosters were posted that may have potentially caused some negative/ill feelings toward Maya, but again nothing was reported.

In the end, if her family is stating that there are some personal issues surrounding her transfer, and this transfer would permit her to potentially continue to participate in athletics in which to continue to enhance her overall high school experience then I would be in favor of her doing so. Obviously this would be a hardship to your league, but I would also make it clear to her, and her family, that there is no guarantee that she will be permitted to participate athletically at another school should they elect to return to HHS.
