Zane has spent quite a bit of time with our family during the summer. We were saddened to hear that his parents were divorcing this summer. On mulitple occasions we helped the family by hosting Zane at our house while his mom moved out and left for Idaho. He decided to stay with his father and finish school in Bandon. Two weeks before school started we were informed that Zane's father had suddently decided that he and Zane were moving to Grants Pass to be with extended family. Zane's grandmother and great-grandmother live there.

A week after school started Zane's dad, Scott Olive, called us and told us that the family situation had become very volatile. Zane's great-granmother was put into hospice for terminal cancer and his grandmother became mentally ill. These two women were supposed to help Mr Olive take care of and support Zane for the next two years of high school. Understanding that their family situation had drastically changed, he asked if we would be willing to allow Zane to live with us and attend Bandon High School while he cares for his physically ill grandmother and mentally ill mother.
