This year, Naomi was offered a scholarship and sponsorships that made her dreams of enrollment in a private school a reality. Naomi is already improving socially, academically, and cognitively. Naomi would like to continue playing volleyball at Umpqua Valley Christian School as it is one of her favorite sports. This transfer is what my daughter needed on many levels and I am hopeful to see her growing into a young woman that will be confident, healthy, and happy.

I hope that you will consider allowing a transfer hardship so that Naomi can continue doing what she loves. Please let me know if there is any other information that I can share to make this process less cumbersome for you.
