Any party filing an appeal of a decision made by the District Athletic Committee to the OSAA Eligibility Appeals Board shall be assessed a filing fee of \$100 to defray the costs to the Association of assembling the respective appeals bodies to hear the appeal.

If a waiver is denied by the OSAA Eligibility Appeals Board, an appeal can be made to a Hearings Officer under OSAA Handbook Rule 9, "Hearings Officer." Appeals to the Hearings Officer shall include an appeal fee of \$250.

My name is Jesse Ammerman I am asking for you to allow me to play football this year. I have recognized the decisions I have made in my freshmen and sophomore years were destructive and did not benefit my future.

I had some things change my life starting with my freshmen physical. I was diagnosed with a heart condition and was told I may never be able to play football again. I have played since I was 8 years old as well as watching my brother play. I am the youngest of 5 brothers. My 2nd oldest brother Aaron played for Springfield high school so the coaches had watch me over his years in high school so they were very excited when I finally made it to high school. Of course the one year I waited for, for so long was stripped of me. I became angry and depressed, then my brother who was my only male figure in my life left to become a Marine. I felt like everything was falling apart in my life. Everything seemed stupid and unnecessary. I didn't have the one person who pushed me to do my best not only in sports but in school and in everything I did I felt lost. Just a few months later my mom moved me to Bend without any warning taking me away from the only place I knew where I was born and raised. I was angry with everything and everyone. I felt like I had nothing. My mom had me move back to Springfield thinking I would do better. I started living with my 21 year old brother and his family, that didn't work, I ended up missing school to babysit my baby niece and nephew. My life was in a bad place.

I want to meet my goal for graduation by going to school doing my credit recovery class as well as do well in my other classes so I can graduate on time. Being a part of a team means the world to me and I ask you to please consider letting me play football now that my life is on track and I'm working hard in school. Jesse made a life changing decision to move back to Bend with me, Jesse wants to graduate high school by working hard to attend school daily, keep up his grades and work hard in his recovery class to get back on track for graduation.

As hard as it was for Jesse to make the move here to better himself and move forward in his future playing football and graduation being part of a team gives him a structure he was lacking the last 2 years.

Jesse is on a much better path now, I hope you will give him the opportunity to get back some of what he lost and longed for back. Jesse's brother is also now mentoring Jesse as well as having the guidance and support at home.
