The information summarized below seemed convoluted and was not consistent. Therefore we voted against it.

It was represented that in the spring the student got a letter of intent to transfer from Benson to Parkrose. Benson AD recalls being told by student that he was already living in Parkrose. Benson AD hears that maybe student is actually living in PPS and so he calls Parkrose AD because Parkrose AD needs to know this.

In the fall Parkrose AD calls Benson to say he called home to learn that student is living in Parkrose with his mother. If the family has moved there is not an issue so Parkrose AD assumes all is well.

At some point Parkrose AD learns that student is living with an uncle and the family has not moved, which means he is not eligible.



At the end of the 2014-15 school year Will came to my office with transfer paperwork. He told me he was intending to transfer to Parkrose High School, the neighborhood school where he lives. After careful consideration, we are filing this Eligibility Request on behalf of Will Likayi. Will is currently a Junior at Parkrose High School. We are appealing for Will because we believe that the circumstances around the situation warrants an appeal.

Will Likayi is a new student at Parkrose High School, so I am still getting to know him. What I've learned, I really enjoy. He is a polite young man, with a good moral compass. He has shown himself to be a good student, and has earned over 16 credits during his first two years of high school. He has good excellent attendance and is currently passing all of his classes.

Will's father is currently living in North Dakota working to make enough money to support his family. He has been away from his family for 3+ years now. Will's mom and siblings tried moving to North Dakota briefly, but being from Congo, they found they could not tolerate the cold temperatures, so they returned to Portland. They are all still hopeful that the father can find work in Portland that will allow him to continue supporting his family. However, until then the family is broken.

During his formative teenage years, Will has been raised by his mother, and is in need of a father figure. This past summer, the extended family decided it would be in Will's best interest to move in with his uncle, his father's brother. His uncle, Marcel Mubikayi, will give Will the adult male influence that he, and every other teenage boy, needs while growing up. While this decision is at odds with the OSAA rules, it was truly made by the extended family with Will's best interest in mind.

My name is Wilfried Likayi I am currently a junior now attending Parkrose High School. I transferred from Benson Polytechnic High School where I have been studying for the past two years.

I am the son of Chouchou Likayi, and for the past two months I've been living with my Uncle, Marcel Mubikayi who lives in the Parkrose School District at:

11841 NE Brazee Street

As a family we decided that it would be best for me. In our culture, being Congolese, if the father ever leaves it's always right for the closest uncle to take care of the first-born male child to get taught real manhood. I felt like my uncle was always a big father figure role to me since I had no one to talk and express myself until I got older in my teens. This being one of the many reasons why we felt as a family that I needed to stay with my uncle. My uncle has been the only one available to me, when I had to deal with my many issues.


As a graduate of the University of Portland and Portland State University, Marcel was also a Head coach of Tigard and Riverdale High School on the Varsity soccer team. Marcel has also worked for Multnomah county health department and also holds his own business. Having a strong background we have thought as a family he was a perfect fit for me. My parents are great individuals but the work schedule and commitment doesn't allow them to provide all the necessary means as a child growing up academically, socially, and emotionally.

Having a single mother growing up working a full-time job working from 6am-6pm weekdays through weekends and a father that hasn't been a big part of my life leaves room for many negative influences and trouble. I have seen that happened to many of my classmates who stayed in tough situations or didn't have family and activities to help them, and Two years ago I found an escape from that by discovering sports in school

As a child all the emotional and hidden anger has given me many different medical issues such as Depression and heart conditions which caused me to miss the second semester of 6th grade and the start of 7th grade. This kept me emotionally scarred until I found my outlet in sports. When I was hospitalized at Emmanuel one of the best advices that my doctor had gave to me was to exercise and try to involve myself into sports programs. At the time I was a short 5'6 kid with lanky arms that can stretch across the whole entire room. I didn't start involving myself into actual sports until I came back on a checkup day that I figured I grew 7 inches in one whole summer listed at 6'1.

These are the few moments I'll never forget in my life because of these people I've received many blessings through my opportunity to play sports. If I ever got this taken away from me it'd be like losing my very first love. I used athletics as a getaway to stay out of trouble and meet new and positive people all striving to succeed. Just like school, sports let me see results from the hard work I put in. While here at my new school I plan to participate in as many sports as possible to keep me fit, and expand my network of positive hard working peers and mentors.

To the OSAA ,

I am Chouchou Likayi the mother of Wilfried Likayi, I have 3 kids including my son Wilfried. My family and I have been through a lot of adversity during the past years since my husband had left the family years ago. Having low income and having to pay the bills and feed my children with no help was getting too much for myself to handle.

I am writing this letter regarding my son and his many issues transferring to different schools, during this harsh process of having Wilfried leave Benson Tech High school he encountered different obstacles and detractors as to where he would be transferring to and where he would be living. Until this point, we were unaware that his move to his uncle's home and transfer to the nearby school (Parkrose) would be require explanation. Especially, with the constant the constant threats of school closures and program omission that have plagued Benson since Wilfried has been there. So our decision to move to move my own son to a more stable home life worked well with the opportunity to move on to a more stable school environment.

From the time of July 31, 2015 Wilfried has been staying at his Uncle's house, and has been making occasional trips to see his sisters and I on the weekends. As a family we had to make this tough decision for his success and because of the times my family and I are going through. Leaving Wilfried under the guidance of his uncle and in a new, secure environment would really help a lot for the family and his future.

For the past years the amount of money I've been getting in wasn't enough to feed to 3 kids to the point I had to make the right decisions for my children. For a young, black teenager, the task of keeping my son involved in positive activities and under the supervision of strong male figures has become difficult for the sake of Wilfried's education, and athletic activities (both of which are constantly at risk for being cancelled or shut down at his previous school) is why we relocated wilfried and he is now staying under his uncle's guidance until his graduation date.

Having to deal with countless issues dealing with marriage, I started to feel that Wilfried couldn't get taught the right manhood from a father figure type role. The closest thing to his father was his Uncle Marcel. Till this day Wilfried continually learns and talks to his uncle like a father.

Since all Wilfried's siblings are all young women, and living in a one-room house, we needed to make a drastic change, that change came in handy leaving Wilfried in one of my brother in-law's extra bedrooms for him to stay in. This is why I had to come to a sad conclusion of keeping my son with his uncle. Even though there is countless of moments I can bring back about my family and how life went I needed to clear the air, even though the conditions I always want the best for my son.

For this is my reason for writing this letter. Parkrose High School Administration and teachers have a great job thus far in providing a positive academic and social environment. We are asking that his opportunities to participate in fall (and soon to be winter) sports are not affected in any way. Thank you for your understanding and consideration.
