I am writing this letter on behalf of our grandson Devin Johnson. Devin has moved from place to place since he was little, this was his lifestyle as his parents were very unstable. He never knew where or when he was going to move again. There was no structure in the home because of an ugly divorce and both his parents having many partners. Devin and his brother were mistreated by their Mother's boyfriends and their Father's girlfriends. Devin has never had a real home until he came to us. Devin had moved 6 times from 2010 until he came to live with us in January 2012. He has always been very close to his older brother, as they are only 15 months apart in age. Their parents have used them as pawns in their battles with each other. Devin feels torn in so many ways, he misses his brother very much. We believe with much coaxing and hours of talking to his brother, he felt he had to go live with his Dad as that is where his brother is now living. We knew this move would not work for Devin but he had to find out for himself, as many teenagers do. We have full custody of Devin and we felt sure he would be back. Long story short, it took only 5 days for Devin to see his mistake. He left the evening of Nov. 11th and called us the morning of Nov. 16th, very upset and wanting to come home. When I picked Devin up the next morning, his Dad told me He could tell Devin was not happy there, even after 2 days. Devin has truly realized where he belongs and where his home is. 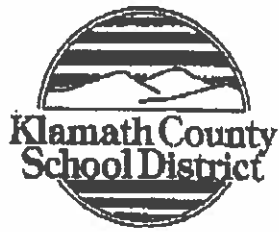

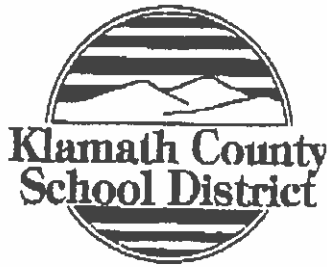

Mt. View District Athletic Committee,

Please find this an athletic hardship letter of support for Devon Johnson, an 11th grade student who is currently attending Bonanza High School. With the exception of enrolling and attending Gilchrist High School for one day Devon has attended school at Bonanza since the middle of his 8th grade year. After consulting with Cindy Simmons at the OSAA it must be stated that due to his enrollment at Gilchrist High School and returning to Bonanza, three OSAA violations have been committed; mid-year transfer, prior affiliation, and joint residence have been violated.

When he entered the 9th grade at Bonanza his grandparents, Mr. & Mrs. Sieminski had delegation of powers which they assumed in January of 2013. Per a notarized copy of the delegation of powers is to cease on 12/20/16. In June 2015 a notarized copy modifying the delegation of powers was agreed to by parents and grandparents (both documents are attached).

Devon participated in wrestling for Bonanza during his 9th and 10th grade years and played football this past football season. He has been a regular student since his enrollment at Bonanza and his attendance has been acceptable. Upon his enrollment at Bonanza, Devon appeared to make an effort to make good choices academically and behaviorally. Shortly after entering his 9th grade year he began making frequent choices that resulted in discipline conferences; choices not worthy of suspension or expulsion but that were impeding his academic success. This trend continued until this year when Devon played football when he seemed to be more content and more focused on school. Although he had not particularly excelled in his academic endeavors I believe he was on the upswing; he began accepting responsibilities for his actions and appeared to be taking school more seriously. Devon has a quiet inverted personality and I believe that this year he started "coming out of his shell" and began making better choices which included meeting with a youth pastor. I personally was pleased to see Devon becoming more actively involved in extra-curricular activities and seeing him in developing a more open personality.

Like many of our students Devon has had challenges in his life which are especially unfair to developing young men. Devon's general circumstances have been outlined in the letter written by his grandparents and my knowledge of his background supports their statement. Since Devon's enrollment at Bonanza, my only interaction with Devon's father took place this fall at a home football game. Prior to the start of the game I was approached by a parent indicating that a "gentleman" over there standing in front of the concession stand had a can of beer. As I was walking toward Mr. Johnson he popped open a can of beer and began to take drink. I told him that he could not have alcohol on school grounds and a female with him stated that they would keep it for later. Mr. Johnson gave me the can and it was obvious to me that he was intoxicated; his speech was slurred and his balance was impaired. I asked him who he was here to see


and he stated that he was here to see his son play. Shortly afterward Mrs. Johnson and the female left the game site and I did not see them the rest of the evening. This incident with Mr. Johnson took place at our home game with Oakland on Friday October 23, 2015. I have not shared this incident with either Devon or his grandparents.

I believe living with his grandparents is good for Devon. Since his return to Bonanza he has appeared to understand the possible life-style offered by his father is not the best for him to be successful, whether at Gilchrist or Bonanza. I would agree with Devon and his grandparents on two points. First, Devon is motivated when participating in athletics-especially wrestling, he knows what is expected of him to maintain eligibility and has been responsible in meeting those expectations; second, Devon made a mistake which is often made by children looking for a hopeful life-style of security and happiness with their parents. He found out that he forgot what this life was like for him personally until he experienced it. The hardship Devon faces is that due to parent choices, his possibility of being academically and behaviorally successful in school is significantly impacted.

It is my hope that serious consideration be given by this request by the Mt. View District Athletic Committee. Please feel free to contact me with additional information.

23 THIS MATTER having come before the Court on the Stipulated Motion Allowing
24 Intervention Under ORS 109.119, and now on the request and stipulation of the parties as
25 evidenced by the notarized signatures below; and the Court having considered the matter and the
26 parties' stipulation, the files and records herein, and otherwise being fully advised in the
premises, makes the following FINDINGS:

A. Petitioner ("Mother") and Respondent ("Father") are the biological parents of
Devin Kyle Johnson, age 16.

1 B. Vernon Sieminski and Esther Sieminski ("Intervenors") are the maternal
2 grandparents of Devin Kyle Johnson.

3 C. The parties and the minor child's dates of birth and social security numbers are
4 confidential information, and are submitted separately herein pursuant to UTCR 2.130.

5 D. Oregon is the home state of the minor child and this Court has exclusive
6 jurisdiction to make child custody determinations in this matter under the UCCJEA,
7
8 ORS 109.701 et. seq.

9 E. The minor child ("Devin") has continuously resided with the Intervenors since
10 January, 2013. Father and Mother have fostered, encouraged, and consented to the relationship
11 between Intervenors and Devin. Intervenors have established a child-parent relationship with
12 Devin as defined by ORS 109.119. Intervenors have provided Devin with food, clothing, shelter,
13 and incidental necessities and provided Devin with necessary care, education and discipline. The
14 ongoing personal relationship between Intervenors and Devin has continued on a day-to-day
15 basis, through interaction, companionship, interplay and mutuality, that fulfilled Devin's
16 psychological needs for a parent, as well as Devin's physical needs. By their signatures
17 hereunder, the legal parents concede that the presumption that they act in Devin's best interests
18 is rebutted. Circumstances detrimental to Devin exist if Intervenors are not granted custody of
19 him.

21 F. The parties have reached an agreement on a modification of the custody and
22 parenting time provisions of the prior Order entered herein as set forth in the Supplemental
23 Judgment Modifying Decree of Dissolution dated June 7, 2007.

- 2 **1. Custody.** Intervenor, Vernon James Sieminski and Esther Fern Sieminski, are
3 awarded legal and physical custody, care, and control of the minor child, Devin Kyle Johnson.

5 **2. Parenting Time.** Father and Mother shall each have the right to visit and spend
6 time with Devin as the parties may agree, or as Intervenor determine is in Devin's best interests.

8 **3. Child Support.** No child support or health care coverage is awarded herein.
9 Intervenor have appropriate private health care coverage available for Devin, which they agree
10 to obtain and maintain at their own expense.

12 **4. Attorney Fees and Costs.** No attorney fees or costs are awarded in this case.

14 **5. Effect of Judgment.** Except as expressly modified by this Stipulated
15 Supplemental Judgment, all other prior Court Orders entered in this case shall remain in effect.

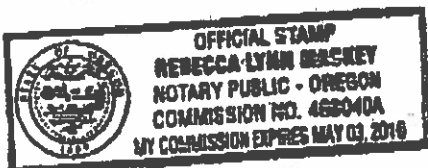

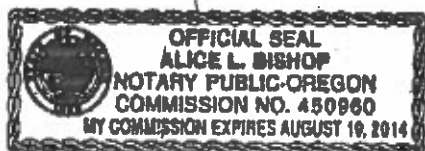

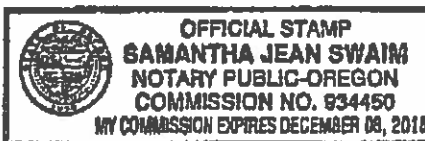
