Churchill is requesting a hardship for a Senior student, Derrick Tollen, for eligibility to participate in Wrestling.

Derrick was a student at Churchill High School his freshman and sophomore year. He then moved to LaCenter, Washington for his Junior year last year and returned at the end of the year last year for a couple of weeks. He was not enrolled long enough at Churchill to receive any credits last Spring.

Over the summer, Derrick turned 18, and decided to stay in Oregon with his brother. His relationship with his father was very volatile, which is why he moved in with his brother last Spring.

At the beginning of this year, Derrick was not on track to graduate by the OSAA standard. In the first trimester, Derrick earned 3.08 credits and is now on track to graduate. He is set to earn 3.33 credits in the second trimester with being enrolled in 5 classes, taking one online course, and the opportunity to earn an additional .33 credits in a Rachel Carson Science course. In the Spring trimester, he will only need 4 classes and/or 2.0 credits to graduate with the opportunity to take an additional class if needed.

Derrick was categorized as a McKinney-Vento student when he showed up to Churchill last Spring. Therefore, qualifying him to enroll at Churchill High School where he began his education.
