Sunset High School is submitting an academic hardship to you for Lexus Webb and supports her request that she be granted eligibility for the remainder of the 2015-2016 Dance season. Lexus ended up with a concussion from ice skating in August of 2015. The attached letter from her mother and supporting documentation from Oregon Health & Science give some additional details.

Due to the concussion it was decided it was best for Lexus to drop down to four classes during the first semester this year and therefore she only has four passing classes. Making her ineligible by OSAA rules. The good news is Lexus, after a lot therapy and tender care, has been cleared to return to dance and has increased her class load to six classes.

While her battle with the head injury is not completely over she has improved and been given clearance to compete. We, at Sunset, believe everything that has happened to her medically over the last five months supports a hardship being granted.
