This letter is in regards to Madyson Meza and her athletic eligibility under OSAA academic requirements. Madyson is currently enrolled here at Monroe High School as a sophomore. Madyson has always lived in the Monroe School District but after enrolling at MHS as a freshman, Madyson transferred to the Oregon Connections Academy (online school) for the remainder of her freshman year. She returned to the high school this past fall and has been in good standing during the 2015-16 school year.

While Madyson did well during her first term with ORCA, she did not finish well and as a result was not academically eligible under OSAA requirements at the beginning of this school year (2015-16). She fell short of both OSAA academic requirements, passing only two courses during her spring semester and not earning enough credits to be considered "on track" to graduate as a first term sophomore. Madyson has re-enrolled at MHS and has done well this school year. She passed seven of eight courses taken this fall and now has 6.5 credits towards her diploma. While still behind, we are confident that Madyson will continue to do well in school and will be able to catch up through summer school and other credit recovery options.

Madison would like to participate in softball here at Monroe High School this spring. She has worked hard in school this year and has had a terrific attitude towards school. She is currently passing all of her second semester courses. I believe that participating in a spring sport will be a great opportunity for Madyson to be involved with a positive peer group.
