Simply put, we could not care less whether she ever wins a race; we just want her to build good solid friendships here in Oregon, so that she really feels that she is a part of the group, rather than forever being the new girl on the periphery who would prefer to be back in Tennessee.

We hope that Mia will be allowed the opportunity to participate in athletics at St. Mary's, particularly since we see this as a huge step towards her adjusting positively to this major change in her life and furthermore beginning to embrace Oregon as her new home.
