The end of my sophomore year came the beginning of my health problems. I began to experience extreme pain in my abdomen. Some days the pain was so bad I was unable to even get out of bed. There would be days I wasn't able to eat or drink anything. I tried to start school and football this year but after my third game of the season, only about two weeks into the school year, I had to stop both because the pain I dealt with every day was too severe.

Deciding that there was no way that I could keep going to school and playing sports was one of the hardest things I have ever had to do. During the six months I had to stay home, I made several trips to the hospital to have tests run. My doctor thought that it could have been cancer so I had to have tests for various cancers. Multiple times I had to stay days in the hospital while these tests were being done because I couldn't eat or stay hydrated without an IV. I had a tumor in my stomach removed by arthroscopic surgery.
