My name is Wendy Burling. I am writing this letter on behalf of my daughter Marilla Burling, who is currently enrolled as a sophomore at Monroe High School in Monroe Oregon.

Marilla would very much enjoy participating on the Lady Dragon softball team, at Monroe High School. Unfortunately she is ineligible because of her academic situation last year while attending South Albany High School.

I really feel Marilla would benefit from being on the softball team, as it would help her build stronger bonds with the students, and give her extra motivation to keep her grades at or above a passing level.

Marilla's previous grades and attendance were poor. In middle school Marilla was targeted by some bullies and had a very hard time trying to maintain her grades and involvement in school activities. Unfortunately she struggled and was not adjusting to middle school as we had liked. We made a family decision to home school her in 8th grade, as we thought this would be the best decision for her. She did well with our homeschool curriculum. Marilla decided she would like to enroll at South Albany High School so she could be on the cheer team. Everything was going well, good grades, attendance was normal for about the first 3 months, when she started to again be bullied, which led her to withdraw and make friends. We took her out of mainstream high school and got her signed up with the online k12 education system. Because we had no previous experience with this programming it pretty much left her on her own to figure out the online schooling, it was not a success and she entered Monroe High School with academic deficits.

While being enrolled at Monroe, Marilla has maintained her grades, at the passing level (A's & B's in all classes- except one) She also has been a member of an ALL STAR cheer team located in Salem during this time. Marilla has two hour practices in Salem, two nights a week, and on Sundays, since school started. During this time she had been able to excel in her academics and attendance has been normal. Her grades have not diminished do to participating in ALL Star Cheer, and I feel confident they will not diminish while playing softball. Marilla is also using her elective class time for a credit recovery class, so she will be on track next year as a junior.

As her mother, I really believe that allowing Marilla to participate in softball will be more of an encouragement and positive aspect in her life, rather than a detriment.

Thank you for your time in reading this letter and considering letting Marilla be a part of the softball team at Monroe High School.

I want to play softball because it would help me build a stronger relationship with some of the girls here since this is my first year at this school. I would also love to play softball because I've wanted to play softball for a while, and now I could have the opportunity of playing.

Last year, for my freshman year, I attended South Albany High School. While I attended that school I did maintain good grades and attendance until I started getting bullied, then it all went downhill from there. I transferred out of South Albany and got enrolled at the Albany online k12 school. The online schooling was very difficult for me because it was something I was new to and I didn't have anyone there to help me. It was also very hard for me to concentrate while doing the online school because I was home alone by myself and there was nobody or nothing there to give me motivation to do it.

Since I have been enrolled at Monroe High School, I have maintained all A's and B's, except for in one class, and my attendance has been normal. At this time I am also a part of an All Star Cheerleading team located in Salem. I go up there two times a week after school to practice for two hours, and then on Sunday to practice. With all that practicing going on and still being in the process of moving down here I maintained good grades and attendance. I am behind in my English class and have some credits missing for that from last year. But I have given up one of my elective classes to take a credit recovery class to then I will be on track for next year, my junior year.

To the MVC Hardship Committee:

This letter is in regards to Marilla Burling and her athletic eligibility. Marilla is currently enrolled here at Monroe High School as a sophomore. Marilla transferred to Monroe from South Albany last summer, but is currently living with her aunt and uncle in our district.

Marilla did not have a positive experience while enrolled at South Albany High School as a freshman. While she performed well academically during her first semester there, she struggled socially. In response to her social struggles, her family made the decision to move her into an online school environment (through the Albany School District) call Albany Online during her second semester. Marilla was not academically successful in the online school environment where structure and assistance are limited. Her family felt that a small school environment (and a new start) would be best for Marilla and they enrolled her in our building this past summer while she lived with her aunt and uncle in our district. According to Marilla's mother, the family is planning to move to Monroe. They just recently sold their current home in Albany and are looking to relocate to our area.

Marilla has had great school year here at Monroe so far. She has integrated well into our building and has worked hard to succeed academically and socially. She is currently enrolled in a full schedule and is working to complete credit recovery courses. Marilla would like to participate in softball this spring (her first high school athletic endeavor) but is not eligible by the OSAA transfer rules or by the "on track to graduate" requirement (she entered the 2015-16 school year with only 3.31 credits earned as a freshmen). We believe it would be a great experience for Marilla to participate in softball and that this opportunity would continue to help her grow and develop as a young adult.

Marilla had some major difficulties in high school related to bullying poor self-esteem. Due to this emotional turmoil she enrolled in a very difficult online high school and chose to discontinue athletics. Unfortunately, Marilla was not able to complete the required credits for OSAA eligibility. She has also recognized that athletics are a valuable part of her life and her social maturity.

From a counseling perspective, I believe that attending Monroe High School is in Marilla's best interest. Many of the factors that have affected her academic success have been out of her control and a change of location is a positive response to get a student back on academic track. I also believe that Marilla can get caught up on credits easily and that athletics will be a positive social interaction for her. I also believe that not allowing athletic participation will be a punitive response for actions that were mainly out of her control..
