Sonja is not normally trying out for sports and I am exceedingly proud that she has gone out for tennis... normally it's all about academics for her and this is definitely what she needs now to get a more well-rounded education. Learning teamwork and good sportsmanship and building up her strength and stamina are going to help her very much at this time in her life.
