Any party filing an appeal of a decision made by the District Athletic Committee to the OSAA Eligibility Appeals Board shall be assessed a filing fee of \$100 to defray the costs to the Association of assembling the respective appeals bodies to hear the appeal.

If a waiver is denied by the OSAA Eligibility Appeals Board, an appeal can be made to a Hearings Officer under OSAA Handbook Rule 9, "Hearings Officer." Appeals to the Hearings Officer shall include an appeal fee of \$250.

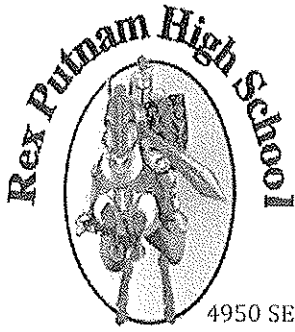

I write this hardship appeal letter, with no reservations, on behalf of Fullington Frazer. Fullington has been practicing with our track program and hopes to be eligible to compete in meets. At this time our track coach expects him to be on the JV team as he has never been in track.

Fullington's situation is a perfect example of why we have the hardship appeal process. He moved to the Putnam area in December from South Carolina. Fullington has lived with several people in his life, has not had contact with his mother since the age of 6, lived with a grandpa who is now ill, and moved across the country to live with the only family member, his aunt, that would take him in and is stable enough to care for him. I believe he will be successful here and his new living situation is the best he's ever had.

The move to the Putnam area was due to hardships out of Fullington's control and was not athletically driven. He has never competed for a high school but I believe being a part of the track program will help him to meet new friends and to be a part of something positive.

Fullington is meeting all academic requirements, has good attendance, and is currently passing all classes. Thank you for considering this hardship appeal that I fully support.

To Whom It May Concern:


I am the current guardian of Fullington William Frazer III and his biological aunt from his paternal side. His mother lost custody of him to the state when he was just 6 years old and he has had no contact with her ever since. His father and stepmother kicked him out of the house at 12 and my father (his grandfather) has been his official guardian since then. Unfortunately my father started to get ill at the end of last year and did not think he could physically care for him any longer. With no one else able or willing to take care of him, my father asked if I could become his caregiver. Reluctant to have him enter the foster care system, I was extremely happy to oblige and give him a stable place to live, as he had already lived with me for two years when he was in elementary school. He came to stay with me on December 22, 2015.

Fullington is a great kid that just needs stability and love in his life, and I have the ability to do this for him. I have lived in the Milwaukie/Oak Grove area for over 8 years now and have a very stable job as an engineer ensuring that I can provide him with everything that he needs. He was home/online schooled for the past few years. I considered continuing with the online schooling when he arrived but instead decided that he could really benefit from being in an enriching learning environment with peers. I enrolled him at Rex Putnam because it was the assigned high school for our current address.

As a former high school and college athlete, I encourage Fullington to play organized sports as a way to give him a healthy outlet for his excess energy while learning about sportsmanship and teamwork. I have talked to him about how positive sports were for my life growing up in a rough urban Miami neighborhood. I think that the opportunity to participate in school athletics will give Fullington the motivation and determination to succeed in every aspect of his life. It also helps me by giving me a way to pair academic achievements as goals that must be met before I allow participation. Fullington is already improving his academic performance because of a desire to take part. He expressed interest in basketball but was saddened to discover that he had missed the deadline to try out, so I was pleased when he said he also started considering running. I truly believe that track and field (and sports in general) can provide him with life long lessons as well as an uplifting environment.

I hope that you will please consider allowing Fullington to participate in sports at Rex Putnam. It is already having such a positive impact on his life.
