

To Whom It May Concern:



I have talked to him about how positive sports were for my life growing up in a rough urban Miami neighborhood. I think that the opportunity to participate in school athletics will give Fullington the motivation and determination to succeed in every aspect of his life. It also helps me by giving me a way to pair academic achievements as goals that must be met before I allow participation. Fullington is already improving his academic performance because of a desire to take part. He expressed interest in basketball but was saddened to discover that he had missed the deadline to try out, so I was pleased when he said he also started considering running. I truly believe that track and field (and sports in general) can provide him with life long lessons as well as an uplifting environment.

I hope that you will please consider allowing Fullington to participate in sports at Rex Putnam. It is already having such a positive impact on his life.
