To Whom It May Concern:

Riley Johnson (DOB February 28, 1999) is a patient under my care. She began treatment in our clinic in May, 2015 due to emotional dysregulation which began after a traumatic brain injury sustained in January of that year. At the initial assessment, it was noted that Riley was unable to attend school due to ongoing sequelae from her concussion and in general was able to minimally participate in what would be considered normal activities of daily living for her age group. Over the course of the last year, she has made significant strides physically, mentally, and emotionally where she is now able to attend partial days of school, though still requires frequent breaks due to lingering symptoms of her concussion. Emotionally, she is in better control of her moods and anxiety which had become problematic after her head injury. She will likely continue to show improvement in symptoms and thus far has shown steady progress towards full recovery. For her, sports are a therapeutic outlet and an important part of her treatment plan. We would be in full support of her ongoing participation within her capabilities and recommend that she be considered for a fifth year of attendance in high school and eligibility for sports.
