7. **CHEMICAL HEALTH POSITION** (*Excerpt OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies*)

(Revised Fall 2015)

The OSAA abides by all state laws and district policies pertaining to the use of tobacco, alcohol, cannabis and illegal drugs. As a general rule, OSAA activities' sites shall be tobacco, alcohol, cannabis and illegal drug free during OSAA events. PRE-STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFICATIONS (from 2026 OSAA Golf Plan)

- E. **4A/3A/2A/1A Girls:** Note: Allocations listed below subject to change due to the number of teams / individuals competing at special district tournaments.
- 1) **Team Automatic Qualifiers:** The top allocated number of teams from the special district tournament. Special District 1 – 2; Special District 2 – 2; Special District 3 – 2; Special District 4 – 2; Special District 5 -- 2; Special District 6 – 2.
 - 2) **Individual Automatic Qualifiers:** The top 5 individuals from each Special District must be in the Top 5 overall to qualify for the State Championships.
 - 3) **Ties:** Any ties for final team or individual qualification spots shall be broken by the Special District prior to submitting the official state championship entry to the OSAA.

2. PRE-STATE CHAMPIONSHIP POSTING TIMELINE:

- A. **All qualifying coaches need to go into iWanamaker and seed their players in preferred order for the first round of the State Tournament. This needs to be completed between the hours of 10am and noon on Wednesday, May 13.**

1) **To do this:**

- a) **Go to the event**
- b) **Go to edit event**
- c) **Go to teams**
- d) **Put team members if preferred order for first day**

4. STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – INDIVIDUAL SPORT SUBSTITUTIONS (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies)

- A. The following shall be the policy for substitutions in individual sport State Championship events. All individuals who are substitutes for individual qualifiers must have participated in a District or Special District Meet.

1) **Individuals:**

- a) **6A and 5A Boys and Girls:** If an individual qualifier drops out of the state championship by 4pm two business days prior (**Thursday, May 14**) to the state championship, the district or regional (depending on how the individual originally qualified) may substitute the next eligible individual qualifier not a member of a qualifying team. The district must notify the OSAA office of any such substitution by 4pm two business days prior (**Thursday, May 14**) to the state championship.
- b) **4A Boys, 4A/3A/2A/1A Girls, 3A/2A/1A Boys:** Substitutions for individual qualifiers not members of qualifying team are not permitted.

- 2) **Team:** Substitutions on qualified teams may be made up to one hour prior to the start of each round of the state championship. A team may enter a maximum of five participants with its top four finishers counting toward team standings.

Notification - Schools are required to notify the OSAA prior to the start of a state championship event if a student entered in the event will be unable to compete for any reason. Failure by a school to notify the OSAA prior to the start of a state championship event may result in a fine and /or other penalty being assessed to that school. **The district must notify the OSAA office, Missy Smith; 503.682.6722 x227 (office), 503.709.4867 (cell).**

By entering participants in a state championship meet, contest or tournament, each member school certifies that, barring injury, illness or unforeseen events, or a withdrawal to avoid violating the religious convictions of team members, the team or individuals representing the school will participate in every game or competition, that is part of that championship event, until the final conclusion of the meet, contest or championship. Any withdrawal or intentional forfeiture for reasons other than those specified shall be considered a sportsmanship violation, and shall be subject to reprimand and/or other penalties as determined by the Executive Board. See [Executive Board Policies, "Withdrawal During a Competition"](#) for more information.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT:

- A. The State Championship will be a two-day 36-hole event. Play will commence each day at 8am.
 - B. **Team Competition:** A school entering a team of four or five players will be competing for the team championship. A school with less than four scores will not be considered a part of the team competition. Team scores shall be determined by adding a team's four best individual scores on the first day of play to a team's four best individual scores on the second day of play. In the event of a tie for first place at the end of the second round, the team with the lower 5th score from Tuesday's round will be declared the champion. If the teams are still tied at that point, the team with the lower 5th score from Monday's round will be declared the champion. If the teams are still tied, the teams will be declared co-champions. Ties for places other than first will not be broken.
 - C. **Individual Competition:** All players in the State Championship may compete for individual honors. Ties for individual honors will not be broken.
2. **PAIRINGS / TEE TIMES:** First round pairings / tee times will be posted on iWanamaker by 6pm on Wednesday, May 13. Second round pairings / tee times will be posted on iWanamaker following play on Monday. Pairings for the second round will be based on first round scores with Monday's team leaders going off the #1 tee last. All 4A/3A/2A/1A Girls tee times for both days will start at 11am.
 3. **COACHES' MEETING:** There will be a coaches' meeting at 7:30pm on Sunday, May 17, in the Eagle Crest Resort Pro Shop and all coaches are encouraged to attend.
 4. **PRACTICE ROUNDS: NOTE: Practice rounds will be available Sunday, May 17 starting at 1:06pm. Coaches will not be allowed to play during the assigned practice rounds as there are only enough times to accommodate participating players. Teams will play in fivesomes and coaches can purchase the use of a golf cart to tour the course with their players for \$23.** Participants will each be charged \$35 for this practice round on Sunday. This includes range balls.
 5. **FROST DELAY PROCEDURE:** Please contact Eagle Crest Resort Course (541.923.4653) beginning at 6:15am on Monday or Tuesday if due to weather conditions a frost delay is possible.
 6. **RANGE BALLS:** Range balls will be provided free of charge on Monday and Tuesday prior to the start of a player's round. Large buckets of range balls will be put out on the practice range at 7am each day. Only players participating in the State Championship should be using the range during this time.
 7. **HOLE LOCATION SHEETS / NOTICE TO PLAYERS:** *Pin sheets and Notice to Players for the State Championship will be on the iWanamaker app under Tournament Information.*
 8. **SUMMER RULES:** Summer rules will be used at the State Championships. In the event of inclement weather/course conditions, the OSAA, in conjunction with the Rules Committee and the course professional, may authorize the Cleaning Ball Local Rule.
 9. **YARDAGE / TEE MARKERS:** Eagle Crest Resort Course has 150-yard markers on each hole. Yardage is also marked on sprinkler heads. All yardage is to the center of the green. Players will use the GREEN tee markers during both rounds of the championship. (See attached sample scorecard for this year's course yardage.) All other tee markers will be removed to avoid confusion.
 10. **SPECTATORS:** Spectators must stay on cart paths or in the rough and at least 30 yards from any competitor during play. At no time should a spectator be on the green, on the tee, in a fairway, in a bunker, in a hazard, nor should they stand behind a player during his/her swing. Spectators may not communicate with participants from the time a player begins his/her round until his/her scorecard is handed in. Competitors may be penalized and / or disqualified if any person, other than the designated coach, assists the competitor by coaching and / or giving advice, which could influence a player in determining play, the choice of a club or method of making a stroke. Spectators may provide a participant with food, towels, umbrellas, rain suits, etc., during a round.

11. **SCORING PROCEDURE:** Competitors must have the OSAA scoring app (iWanamaker) downloaded on their phone prior to teeing off. Each player should keep their own backup scorecard. Each competitor (marker) will be responsible for keeping score for another competitor in the group on the app. After each hole, the marker should check the score with the competitor and attest it.

At the conclusion of the round, the entire group shall proceed immediately to the scoring area. The marker should confirm the digital scorecard. Competitors are to review their digital scorecard thoroughly for the accuracy of the hole-by-hole score and settle any disputes with the Rules Committee. The competitor is responsible for the correctness of the digital score recorded for each hole on his digital scorecard. If they return a score for any hole lower than actually taken, they are disqualified. If they return a higher score for any hole than the score actually taken, the score as returned stands. The competitor should make sure the marker has attested / confirmed the digital scorecard at the score table. No alteration may be made on a digital scorecard after the competitor has attested / confirmed it and left the scoring area. The digital scorecard is considered to have been official when the competitor leaves the scoring area.

12. **CELL PHONES / MOBILE DEVICES:**

- A. **Coaches and Spectators:** Cell phones must be set to vibrate or silent mode and shall not ring at any time while on the golf course. Cell phone conversations are prohibited at all times while on the golf course. If you need to take/make a call, please proceed to the clubhouse or parking lot

13. **PACE OF PLAY:** The OSAA and the host courses are emphasizing pace of play during this year's state championships. Groups are expected to adhere to the pace of play guidelines printed on their scorecard. A group's position should be immediately behind the group in front, not immediately in front of the group behind. Groups may be affected if they are behind the scheduled pace and out of position. Out of position is defined as:

- A. **On par 3** – Having a clear hole ahead.
- B. **On par 4** – The group ahead replaces the flagstick before your group leaves the tee area.
- C. **On par 5** – The group ahead arrives on the green before your group leaves the tee area.

14. **CARTS:**

- A. **Motorized Carts – Participants:** During the round, a player must not ride on any form of motorized transportation except as authorized or later approved by the Committee (a player may always ride to and from where a previous stroke was made). Penalty for breach of Local Rule is the general penalty for each hole where the breach occurred. If the breach occurred between the play of two holes, it applies to the next hole.
- B. **Motorized Carts – Spectators:** Spectators, at the discretion of the golf course, may use motorized golf carts at the OSAA State Championships. Fees, rules and regulations of the use of golf carts are governed by the host golf course.
- C. **Pull Carts – Participants:** Participants can use a pull cart in competition. Please note that there are a limited number of carts available and there may be a per round rental fee. Eagle Crest rents pull carts for a fee.

15. **RULES COMMITTEE:** The OSAA will have a Rules Committee at the State Championship. Rules Committee members will be on the course in clearly marked golf carts to answer questions and make rules interpretations as necessary. Committee members will have walkie-talkies in order to collaborate on rulings.

16. **UNSPORTSMANLIKE BEHAVIOR:** A Rules Committee member may disqualify a player without warning for unsportsmanlike conduct such as throwing a club, disrespectfully addressing or striking an opponent or official, using profanity or obscene gestures, intentionally obstructing an opponent's line of play, etc.

- A. Any disqualification for unsportsmanlike conduct disqualifies the player for the entire championship. Substitution of a player disqualified for unsportsmanlike conduct is not permitted.
- B. Disqualification for a violation of USGA rules applies to that day's competition only.

17. **RESTROOMS / WATER ON COURSE:** Eagle Crest Resort Course has on-course restrooms near #4, #9, #13, #18. Restrooms are also available in the clubhouse and near the practice putting green. Water coolers will be placed around the course every few holes near the tee box.

18. **FOOD:** Eagle Crest Resort Course has a snack bar in the clubhouse, which will open at 7am each day. Coaches are encouraged to order lunches for players at the start of each day to avoid having to wait in line.

19. **AWARDS:** All awards will be presented following the conclusion of each championship on Tuesday.

- A. **Trophies** – Champion through fourth place trophies will be awarded in each championship.

- B. **Medals** – Medals will be presented to the champion and second place teams in each championship. Medals will also be presented to the top ten individuals at each state championship who will be recognized as members of the OnPoint Community Credit Union All-Tournament Team.
- C. **Moda Health Athlete of the Meet** – The medalist in each classification will be recognized as that classification’s Moda Health Athlete of the Meet. In the event of a tie for medalist, multiple winners will be recognized. The winners will receive a commemorative coin from Moda Health and a scholarship application.
- D. **Flags** – The Oregon Golf Course Superintendents Association (OGCSA) has generously donated logo flags for use during each of this year’s state championships. Their goal is to familiarize young golfers with the OGCSA and bring awareness to their role in the game today. The logo flags will be distributed to the top finishers at each of this year’s state championships.

EAGLE CREST RESORT COURSE – NOTICE TO PLAYERS

1. The Rules of Golf and the OSAA Hard Card, as modified by these Local Rules, govern all play. Please disregard all Local Rules on the Eagle Crest Ridge Course score card.
2. **TEEING AREA:** Play will be from the designated tee boxes assigned by the Rules Committee.
3. **ADVICE:** Each school may appoint two OSAA Certified coaches from their school who may give advice to members of their team during a round. Advice givers must be identified to the Committee before giving advice. Advice may be given everywhere except for on the green. Advice must be given in a private manner to not influence other players and not delay pace of play. The penalty for each breach of this Rule by an advice giver is the General Penalty (two strokes) added to the player's score who is involved. The committee reserves the right to remove an advice giver's privilege and disqualify the player and/or the player's team for a repeated breach of this rule during a competition.

ONCE A PLAYER'S BALL IS ON THE GREEN,

THE COACH(ES) IS NO LONGER ALLOWED TO COACH THAT PLAYER FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE HOLE.

4. **OUT OF BOUNDS (RULE 18):** When two stakes are placed within two yards of each other, the boundary is deemed to extend to infinity in the direction of the two stakes. The inside edge of all paved roadways, including public roads, define the out of bounds edge. **Note:** Some homeowners have signs on their property stating "Out of Bounds, Free Drop." **These signs are to be ignored during the championship.**
5. **OBSTRUCTIONS (RELIEF: RULE 16):** The following are defined as immovable obstructions: artificially surfaced cart paths and roads and their extensions, sprinkler heads and sprinkler control boxes. Relief from staked trees is for the stake and/or tie only. **Exception:** Chipped bark pathways are integral parts of the course and relief without penalty is not available. Individual pieces of bark are loose impediments.
6. **GROUND UNDER REPAIR (RULE 16):**
 - A. Ground under repair includes all French drains and maintained flower beds.
 - B. Animal holes that interfere only with a player's stance are deemed not to be, of itself, interference under Rule 16. Relief without penalty is not available.
7. **POWER LINES AND CABLES. HOLE #8:** Local Rule E-11 is in effect. If it is known or virtually certain that a player's ball hit a power line during the play of hole #8, the stroke does not count. The player must play a ball without penalty from where the previous stroke was made (see Rule 14.6).
8. **PACE OF PLAY:** The maximum time allowed for the stipulated round is four hours and forty-five minutes. Any player exceeding the allowed time and out of position as defined in the pace of play policy is subject to a possible penalty under Rule 5.6.
9. **CLEANING BALL LOCAL RULE:** If the Committee determines that course conditions warrant, Model Local Rule E-2 will be in place and players will be notified on the first tee.

When a player's ball lies in the general area, the ball may be lifted, cleaned and replaced without penalty. The player must mark the spot before lifting the ball (see Rule 14.1) and the ball must be replaced on its original spot (see Rule 14.2).

Note: This Local Rule does not provide a preferred lie. The ball must be replaced on its original spot.

10. **SCORING:** Promptly upon completion of the round, all players in the group must proceed to the scoring area to resolve any Rules issues and confirm their scores in iWanamaker. Each player is responsible to make sure that their marker certifies the hole scores. No alterations may be made on the scorecard once it has been returned. A scorecard is considered returned when the player has confirmed the scorecard with a scoring official and has left the defined scoring area.

11. **TIES:**

Team Competition: In the event of a tie for first place at the end of the second round, the team with the lower 5th score from Tuesday's round will be declared the champion. If the teams are still tied at that point, the team with the lower 5th score from Monday's round will be declared the champion. If the teams are still tied, the teams will be declared co-champions. Ties for places other than first will not be broken.

Individual Competition: All players in the State Championships may compete for individual honors. Ties for individual honors will not be broken.

12. **FINAL DECISIONS ON DISPUTED POINTS –** Will be made by Missy Smith, Peter Weber, Brent Whittaker



The Rules of Golf as approved by the United States Golf Association and the R&A govern play and where applicable, by the following Local Rules and Terms of the Competition. Complete text of Rules and Local Rules may be found in the Official Guide to the Rules of Golf, effective January 2026. Unless otherwise noted, the penalty for breach of a Local Rule is the general penalty. See Notice to Players for additional Local Rules and Terms of the Competition. If a player in a team competition breaches a Rule that results in disqualification, the effect will be to disqualify the player for that round only. Exception: serious misconduct, in which it is up to the Committee.

Please note that while in some earlier competitions this year the Local Rule for Alternative to Stroke and Distance for Ball Lost or Out of Bounds may have been used, the Local Rule is not in effect for any competition covered by this document.

1. **OUT OF BOUNDS:** Defined by the line between the course-side points, at ground level, of the white stakes or fence posts. Out of bounds may also be defined by white lines.
2. **PENALTY AREAS:** When a penalty area is defined on only one side, it extends to infinity. When a penalty area is connected to the out of bounds edge, the penalty area extends to and coincides with out of bounds.
3. **GROUND UNDER REPAIR:**
 - A. Defined by white lines. Ground under repair also includes French drains, which are trenches filled with rocks or stones and newly trenched areas, including grass-covered cables. See Temporary Power Lines and Cables.
 - B. Ground under repair may include areas of unusual damage, including areas where spectators or other traffic has combined with wet conditions to affect materially the ground surface, but only when so declared by an authorized member of the Committee. When immediately adjacent to an obstruction, such an area is part of the obstruction.
4. **IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS:** Include plastic bumpers on roads and paths, and mats secured to the ground with spikes when the bumpers or mats cover cables.
5. **IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS CLOSE TO PUTTING GREENS:** Model Local Rule F-5.1 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.
6. **RELIEF FROM SEAMS OF CUT TURF:** Model Local Rule F-7 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. If a player's ball lies in or touches a seam of cut turf or a seam interferes with the player's area of intended swing: (a) Ball in the General Area. The player may take relief under Rule 16.1b. (b) Ball on Putting Green. The player may take relief under Rule 16.1d. But interference does not exist if the seam only interferes with the player's stance.
7. **WHITE-LINED AREAS TYING INTO ARTIFICIALLY SURFACED ROADS AND PATHS:** White-lined areas of ground under repair and the artificially surfaced roads, paths or other identified obstructions that they are connected to are a single abnormal course condition when taking relief under Rule 16.1.
8. **WOOD CHIPS AND MULCH:** Are loose impediments.
9. **INTEGRAL OBJECTS:** Include objects, such as cables, rods, wires or wrappings, when closely attached to trees and boundary objects, and artificial walls and pilings when located in penalty areas or in or adjacent to bunkers, and bunker liners. An exposed bunker liner may be treated as ground under repair, but interference does not exist if the liner interferes only with the player's stance.
10. **BALL DEFLECTED BY POWER LINE:** Model Local Rule E-11 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. If it is known or virtually certain that a player's ball hit a permanent power line, tower, or a wire or pole supporting a power line during the play of a hole, the player must replay the stroke by playing the original ball or another ball from the spot where that stroke was made (see Rule 14.6).
11. **TEMPORARY POWER LINES AND CABLES:** Model Local Rule F-22 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.
12. **TEMPORARY IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS:** Model Local Rule F-23 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.
13. **LIST OF CONFORMING DRIVER HEADS:** Model Local Rule G-1 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.

14. **LIST OF CONFORMING GOLF BALLS:** Model Local Rule G-3 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.
15. **TRANSPORTATION:** Model Local Rule G-6 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. During the round, a player must not ride on any form of motorized transportation except as authorized or later approved by the Committee (a player may always ride to and from where a previous stroke was made).
16. **PROHIBITING USE OF CERTAIN TYPES OF SHOES:** Model Local Rule G-7as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.
17. **PROHIBITING USE OF AUDIO AND VIDEO DEVICES:** Model Local Rule G-8 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Rule 4.3a (4) is modified in this way: During a round, a player must not listen to or watch content of any nature on a personal audio or video device.
18. **USE OF CADDIE PROHIBITED:** Model Local Rule H-1.1 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. A player must not have a caddie during the round.
19. **RESTRICTIONS ON PRACTICE BEFORE OR BETWEEN ROUNDS:** Model Local Rule I-1.1 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Rule 5.2b is modified in this way: a player must not practice on the competition course before or between rounds. Penalty for breach of Local Rule, see Rule 5.2
20. **RESTRICTION ON PRACTICE OR TESTING BETWEEN THE PLAY OF TWO HOLES:** Model Local Rule I-2 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. A player must not make any practice stroke on or near the putting green of the hole just completed or test the surface of that putting green by rubbing the putting green or rolling a ball or make any practice stroke on or near any practice green.
21. **STOPPING AND RESUMING PLAY:**
 - A. A suspension of play for a dangerous situation will be signaled by one prolonged note of a siren or horn. All other suspensions will be signaled by three consecutive notes of a siren or horn. In either case, resumption of play will be signaled by two short notes of a siren or horn. See Rule 5.7b. **Note:** All practice areas are closed during an immediate suspension for a dangerous situation until the Committee has declared them open. Players who practice on closed practice areas will be asked to stop practicing; failure to stop practicing might result in disqualification.
 - B. When play is suspended by the Committee, if the players in a match or group are between the play of two holes, they must not resume play until the Committee has ordered a resumption of play. If they have started play of a hole, they may discontinue play immediately or continue play of the hole, provided they do so without delay. If the players choose to continue play of the hole, they are permitted to discontinue play before completing it. Before lifting the ball, the player must mark its position. The players must resume play when the Committee has ordered a resumption of play. Resumptions of play will be signaled by two short notes of a siren or horn.
22. **DRESS CODE:** Players must adhere to the dress codes set out by each hosting course.
23. **ADVICE:** Each school may appoint two OSAA Certified coaches from their school who may give advice to members of their team during a round. Advice givers must be identified to the Committee before giving advice. Advice may be given everywhere except for on the green. Advice must be given in a private manner to not influence other players and not delay pace of play. The penalty for each breach of this Rule by an advice giver is the General Penalty (two strokes) added to the player's score who is involved. The committee reserves the right to remove an advice giver's privilege and disqualify the player and/or the player's team for a repeated breach of this rule during a competition.

**ONCE A PLAYER'S BALL IS ON THE GREEN,
THE COACH(ES) IS NO LONGER ALLOWED TO COACH THAT PLAYER FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE HOLE.**

24. **SCORING AREAS AND PROCEDURES:** Details on scorecard return procedures and scoring areas will be provided on the Notice to Players at each event.
25. **MODIFICATION OF PENALTY UNDER RULE 3.3b(2) FOR MISSING PLAYER OR MARKER CERTIFICATION:** Model Local Rule L-1 as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect.
26. **WHEN COMPETITION IS FINAL:** The competition is final when the trophy has been presented to the winner or, in the absence of a prize ceremony, when all scores have been approved by the Committee.
27. **UNSPORTSMANLIKE BEHAVIOR:** A player may be disqualified without warning for unsportsmanlike conduct such as throwing a club, disrespectfully addressing or striking another player or official, using profanity or obscene gestures, intentionally obstructing another player's line of play, etc.
 - A. Any disqualification for unsportsmanlike conduct disqualifies the player for the entire championship. Substitution of a player disqualified for unsportsmanlike conduct is not permitted.
 - B. Disqualification for a violation of USGA rules applies to that day's competition only.
